The 2nd Asia Pacific Linguistics Olympiad (APLO 2020) was held simultaneously in six countries/regions, on September 27, 2020.

A total 97 contestants participated in 7 cities. The top 8 students from each delegation are regarded as official participants.

In addition, five countries/regions have participated in APLO 2020 as a guest: Colombia, Latvia, Ukraine, Russia, and Canada. The results of guest countries will be updated after all the guest countries have finished their contest and grading.

APLO 2020 participants competed to solve problems on diverse languages including Iaii, Walman, Koyra Chiini, Tübatulabal, and Mantauran (Rukai). The problem set was provided in 10 different language versions. Problems and solutions will be published on the APLO website on October 26, 2020.

Among the 48 official participants, 38 medals (5 gold, 11 silver, and 22 bronze) and 10 honorable mentions have been awarded by the International Jury. Cut-off scores are:
